B. Not a s_____.

- 1. Def: “*Not speaking evil of others.*”
- 2. She can keep confidences and not gossip.

C. Sober

- 1. Def: “Controls herself, able to exercise good judgment, not rash or flippant.”
- 2. Titus 2:3-4 also tells older woman teach the younger to be sober.
- 3. No place for unstable, frivolous, giddy woman in leadership.

D. Faithful in all things (totally t_____).

- 1. Includes every phase of the work of the Lord.
- 2. She is to be a suitable helper for her husband (Gen 2:18).
