

WHO WAS THE AUTHOR?

- Unknown.
- Why not Samuel?
 - Samuel dies before many of the narrated events occurred (I SAM 25:1).
 - Samuel did write the record of "Samuel the Seer" (I Chron. 29:29) and defined ideal kingship (I Sam 10:25).
 - Why name these books after Samuel?
 - Samuel is chosen because of his important work. Known as the "king maker!" Key figure at the start.
 - He is the *transition figure* between the *tribal* confederacy and the monarchy (Acts 3:24, 13:20).
 - He was a judge, priest, and a great man of faith (Heb 11:32).

Why *two books* of Samuel?

- These were originally one scroll.
- Divided up by Septuagint translators (270 BC).
- The break is unfortunate because it separates the death of Saul from David's great lament.

When was it written?

- Sometime during the divided kingdom.
- I Sam 27:6 "Ziklag pertains unto the kings of Judah unto this day."

- History/Reign of Saul (I Sam 8-15).
- History of David (I Sam 16-31).
- David's Reign as King (2 Samuel)

Why so much emphasis on David?

How much time is covered?

- About 125 years total.
- 1140 -1015 BC.
- Last two judges and first two kings!

An Important Transitional Figure Samuel's Birth and Early Life (I Sam 1-3).

Wicked children but great parents, and an especially amazing mother!

Who was Hannah?


- Name: <u>Gracious, compassionate</u>.
- Spiritual. Saw the Divine perspective (I Sam 2:1-10)!
- Wife of Elkanah, a righteous God-fearing Levite.
- Elkanah's Name = "pure."





Who was Hannah?

- Mother of Samuel, a faithful judge and priest (I Chron 6:16; 28).
- A Woman of Character: Lives up to her name!





- Shared worship together (I Sam 1:3;7).
- · Hannah married a devout man!
- Godly fathers make being a godly mother so much easier!

Heritage Foundation Study:

- Regular church attendance is a critical factor in marital stability.
- Those who switch partners most are those with <u>no religious convictions!</u>
- Cohabitation before marriage is 7 times higher among the non-religious.
 Significant because those who live together before marriage experience higher divorce rates.

Godly Mother's Profile: Right Relationship with Husband

- Shared love together! How know?
 - -Hannah received a "double portion" (I Sam 1:4).
 - -His love was her security!
 - -Shared worship and love eliminates major conflicts!
 - -Missing ingredient = children(vs 5)!

Godly Mother's Profile: Right Relationship with God


- Turns to Prayer (vs 9-10).
 - -Had a Passion for God's best: CHILDREN (vs 11).
 - -A Woman of Fervency (vs 12).
 - How do we know?
 - Knew Elkanah was not the source of children! God is the source (Gen 4:1; 25)!

Godly Mother's Profile: Right Relationship with God

- Hannah = "Selfless Steward" (vs 11)
 - DESIRED TO GIVE HER CHILD INTO GOD'S SERVICE!
 - -Woman of purity & virtue (vs 12-17).
 - -Woman of patience & faith (vs 18).

Godly Mother's Profile: Right Relationship with God

- RESULT?
 - -Vs 19 "God remembered her..."
 - -Vs 20 "She conceived and bore a son and called him *Samuel*."
 - -NAME: "ASKED OF GOD."
- Ch 2: 1-10 SONG OF THANKS-GIVING!



- Right Relationship at home.
 - -Dedicated to Samuel (1: 21-23).
 - -Dedicated him to the Lord (1:24)!
 - -Never forgot Samuel (vs 2:19).



- The Lord never takes without giving!
- 2:21 "The Lord visited Hannah and she conceived and bore three sons and two daughters."
- 2:21b "The child Samuel grew before Jehovah."

GREAT CONTRAST

- Eli's sons are wicked. WHY?
- MOTHER IS NOT IN THE PICTURE!
- There is no price high enough to value the virtue of a godly mother!



HANNAH

 May Hannah's legacy be the legacy of all the mom's at Kirkland!



Notice the contrast between the sons of Eliand Samuel (2:11-12, 17,22-26).

What was Eli's sin? (2:29)
