
"Until His word came to pass, Jehovah tested (tried) him" (Ps 105:19).

Trained and tested through injustice!


## Joseph suffered three main injustices over 13 years.



### Joseph suffered three main injustices over 13 years.




- Victim of Hatred & Jealousy

### Insights from I Chron. 16: 8-11, then David repeats Ps 105:1-15.

God was with him through the years fleeing King Saul, just as He was with his forefathers! Period of rejoicing with the ark of the covenant."

### Gen 41:56-57, Gen 42

- All countries came to Egypt to buy grain (41:56-57).
- 10 brothers go to Egypt (42:3-4).
- They bow down before Joseph (42:6b, vs 9).
- Joseph recognized them (42:7-8).
- Accused them of being spies (42:9b).

#### Gen 42: 10-24

- What is the test that Joseph gives them to prove their story (42:19-20)?
  - Bring back Benjamin!
  - Leave Simeon as hostage.
- How did the ten brothers react (42:21-24)?
- What caused Joseph to weep (42:24)?

#### Gen 42: 25 - 38

- What did Joseph do with the money they paid for the grain (42:25)?
- What was their reaction (42:28)?
- They told Jacob and what did he say (42: 36)?
- Why would Jacob not take up Rueben on his offer (42:37-38)?

#### **Gen 43**

- Who protested at Jacob's plan to buy more grain (43:1-5)?
- Who offered to be "a surety" and take the blame if Benjamin is not returned alive (43:8-9)?
- Jacob's final words (43:14-15)?
- What did Joseph do upon seeing them (43:16-18, 23, 27-30,33-34)?
- Why give Benjamin 5 times more?

#### Gen 44

- How did Joseph trick them as they were leaving (44:2)?
- Once accused what did they say (44:9-13)?
- How does Judah become the hero of the story (44:18, 22, 27, 33)?

# Why did Judah get the nod? Gen 49:10-12

Gen 44: 14-34

He offered himself as the substitute and took the rap for Benjamin!

He saved/redeemed his brother!

He was ring-leader, now willing to become a slave himself!

#### Gen <u>45</u>

- Joseph revealed himself (45:1-3).
- Why troubled (45:3)?
- What was Joseph's reaction (45:4 28).

### **Letting Go of the Past**

Gen 41: 51-52 "God has made me forget all my trouble and my father's household."

- Joseph overcame a bitter past and maintained a positive outlook!
- Have you come to terms with your past?

## Three Secrets of Josephs Success

- Dealt with Past, Present, and Future . . . Balanced Way!
- Took the hurt wounds of the past and fixed them so they would heal properly.
- He kept his faith in God strong so it would serve as the anchor throughout his trials/successes!

### We must live in the present

- Matt 6:34 "Each day has enough trouble of its own."
- Ps 118:24 "This is the day the Lord hath made, we will rejoice."
- Like submarines in air-tight compartments!

### How do we relate to the future?

- Worry = prayer to the wrong God!
- We Must Learn to Trust in God!
- Joseph was able to see the hand of God in His life (Gen 50: 19-20)!
- Joseph: Gen 45:5-10 Part of God's plan... okay!
- How did Joseph react when he realized his brothers never really believed that he forgave him?
- Gen 50:15-20

### How do we relate to the Past?

- Must not dwell on it (Josh 1).
- Must not over-react to it!
  - Illustration: I Kings 1:6 Adonijah
  - 6 His father had never crossed him at any time by asking, "Why have you done so?"
  - Why would David spoil him so?

### Joseph could have reacted

- I will never trust anyone!
- I will give up on doing right and serving God!
- "We are affected by our past but we are not prisoner's of it!"
- Must let go release through forgiveness.
  - Eph 4:31 Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. 32 Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you

### **How Does God Forgive?**

Does not forget, just decides not to hold it against us any longer.

- Sins are blotted out, but leave scars!
- We can distinctly remember forgetting something happened.

Antitype — the spiritual reality



To be sold, to suffer and to be exalted — Gen 45:5-8;


