Death of the Firstborn

- Was prophesied (Ex 4:22-23, 11:1, 4-7).
- Whom did the first born include (Ex 12:29-32a)?
 - Egyptian males and their cattle (Ex 1:22).

Death of the Firstborn

Most important of the plagues...

Why did this one finally work?

- It was the ultimate insult!
- Greatest loss/sacrifice (Jn 3:16)!

This event became Israel's BD!

- The Exodus marked the first month and day of their religious calendar (Ex 12:2).
 - Month – ABIB (Hebrew).
 - After Babylon – NISAN – (Neh 2:1).
- When we contact the blood (have our sins passed over) it is our *spiritual BD* also (2 Cor 5:17)!

Ex 12:32b

- Pharaoh asked for Moses to do what?
 - “Bless me also”
 - WHAT?
 - *“The lesser is blessed by the greater”* (Heb 7:7).

Ex 12: 33-43

- “Took their dough *before it was leavened*” (12:34,39).
 - Reason for unleavened bread in the L.S.
- “They *despoiled the Egyptians*” (12:36).
 - “Hosts of Jehovah went out” – (12:41).
- “This is the *ordinance of the Passover*, and *no foreigner shall eat thereof*” (12:43).

Cleanse out the old leaven that you may be
a new lump, as you really are unleavened.

For Christ, our Passover lamb,

has been sacrificed. Let us therefore celebrate the festival, not with the old leaven,
the leaven of malice and evil, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

The Characteristics of the Lamb

- Male, **without blemish** (Ex 12:5, I Peter 1:18-19).
- **Bones not broken** (Ex 12:46, Jn 19:33).
- **Complete sacrifice** (Ex 12:8-10).
 - *Entire lamb was to be eaten. It was a “sanctified food” not be used for a common purpose/meal.*

The Characteristics of the Lamb

- The saved family ate the sacrifice —
 - O.T. Ex 12:8
 - NT. I Cor 10:16-17
- Who killed the lamb?
 - O.T. The people who ate the meal (Ex 12:6).
 - N.T. Who killed Jesus?
 - We did when we sinned!

#2. The Theological Principles of Deliverance

- Saved by GRACE!
 - Israelites redeemed because of the promise (Ex. 6:5-7, Eph 2:8-9)!
- Saved by FAITH (Heb 11:6).
- Saved by OBEDIENCE (Heb 5:8-9).
- Both had the same RESULT!
 - Salvation (Rm 6:3-4)!
 - Rejoicing (Ex 15).

#2. The Theological Principles of Deliverance

- Why put the blood on the door post and lintels (Ex 12: 22a)?
- To teach us to not be ashamed and to be willing to publically confess Jesus--Rm 10:9-10, Mk 8:38.

#2. The Theological Principles of Deliverance

- Why must one stay in the house until the morning (Ex 12: 22b)?
 - I Tim 3:15 “the church = house of God.”
 - Our salvation is *contingent upon staying faithful.*

#2. The Theological Principles of Deliverance

- What does this teach us about our testimony?

- The Israelites were to speak of it always (Ex 12: 24-27, 13: 8-9).

What are we to do?

- I Peter 3:15 “Be ready...”
- Matt 10:32-33 “If we confess Him before men....”

Our Lord and Savior

- The Passover meal was a *shadow* of the *spiritual realities* symbolized in the Lord's supper.



MESSIAH IN THE PASSOVER

Our Lord and Savior

- Both were commemorated in a memorial that looks both backwards and forwards!
- Redemption (Exodus) & Fulfillment-Promise!

- Redemption (Cross) Fulfillment-Promise

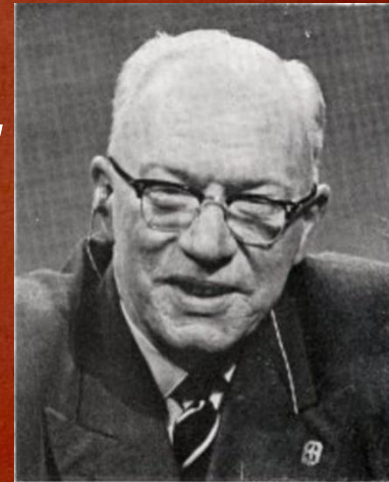
