### Thought questions:

How is Samson a type of Christ?

- 1. His birth and calling.
- 2. His taking a Gentile bride.
- 3. Destroying the lion in the vineyard.
- 4. The wedding feast
- 5. Striking out against the enemy as God's appointed deliverer.
- 6. The betrayal of Samson (twice)
  - 7. Samson's death.

Samson did his greatest work in darkness with outstretched arms!

He laid down his life voluntarily to set his people free.



Do you see anything astounding in the response of the Israelites to the Philistines (15:9-12)?

Here was the champion of the Israelites. A man of super-human strength around which any group of people would rally (there were 3,000 of them), and around whom the Danites could easily use to throw off the yoke of the Philistines. Yet they feared that all Samson would accomplish would be to make the Philistines mad at them. Their lack of faith in God is truly astounding.



After Samson had killed 1,000 Philistines, from what did God save him? What argument did he use in his appeal to God?

It was a lot of work killing 1,000 men, so it is not unexpected that he would be quite thirsty afterwards.

He reasoned that to die of thirst (and thus fall into the hands of the Philistines) would thwart all of God's plans for him. Thus, it was only reasonable that God should provide him with water (15:18).

#### How did Samson leave his 'mark' on the city of Gaza?

Samson went to Gaza to visit a prostitute and while he was there, the Philistines decided to set an ambush for him. But he left early (at midnight) and ripped the gates of the city from the walls and the ground and carried them to a hill near Hebron (16:1-3).



## How many lords of the Philistines were there? How many pieces of silver was Delilah promised?

There were 5 lords of the Philistines (3:3).

She was promised 1,100 pieces of silver from each lord (16:5). This would have made her quite wealthy.



## What were the 3 answers to the 'riddle' of his strength that Samson told Delilah?

- a. He would be helpless if he were bound with 7 fresh bowstrings that had not been dried (16:7)
- b. He would be helpless if he were bound with new ropes that had never been used (16:11)
- c. He would be helpless if the 7 locks of his head were woven and bound with a pin (16:13)




