FOREVER YOUNG

"May you grow up to be righteous, may you grow up to be true, may you always know the truth and see the light surrounding you. May

you always be courageous, stand upright and be strong. May you stay forever young, forever young, forever young, may you stay forever young." That is the second verse from the song written by Bob Dylan and aptly titled, "Forever Young". While the backstory to the song is that it was written for Bob Dylan's son, Jakob. Nevertheless, the lyrics ring so true for those who feel the years creeping up on them, "stay forever young". To be sure we do slow down somewhat as we age, but one cannot give in!

The Scriptures are replete with numerous examples of individuals who aged with grace. "Moses was one hundred and twenty years old when he died. His eyes were not dimmed natural nor his vigor diminished." (Deuteronomy 34:7) Dorcas, was active up to the point of her death, serving the poor and widows (see Acts 9:36-39). In the 92nd psalm the following is found. "The righteous man will flourish like the palm tree, he will grow like a cedar in Lebanon. Planted in the house of the Lord, they will flourish in the courts of our God. They will still yield fruit in old age; they shall be full of sap and very green." (v. 12-14)

Solomon makes a valid point in Ecclesiastes chapter twelve and verse one. "Remember your Creator in the days of your youth, before the difficult days come, and the years draw when you say, I have no pleasure in them." While that is the ideal, there is the recognition that you can't change the past (see Philippians 3:8-14), and you must press on to that which lays ahead, mindful of the seeds that you are now sowing. "Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, this he

will also reap. For the one who sows to his flesh shall from the flesh reap corruption, but the one who sows to the Spirit, shall from the

Spirit reap eternal life." (Galatians 6:7 -8)

While the years may take some of the vibrancy away in a physical sense, there is no need to lose vigor spiritually or emotionally, stay engaged; find a way to be of service and doing something. "Therefore we do not lose heart, but though our outer man is decaying, yet our inner man is being renewed day by day." (2Corinthians 4:16) There is a unique beauty in aging. Job noted

in his response to Zophar, "Wisdom is with aged men, and with length of days, understanding." (12:12) Take note of what Solomon pens in Proverbs 20:29. "The glory of young men is their strength, and the honor of old men is their gray hair." Those who have been fortunate enough to be granted long life, should have garnered wisdom and insight to share with those who are younger. To be an example in conduct, love, purity, wisdom and faith.

Thomas Bailey Aldrich, who was a noted poet, editor and author in the mid 1800's, wrote, "To keep the heart unwrinkled, to be hopeful, kindly, cheerful, reverent-that is to triumph over old age." Rock singer, David Bowie is quoted as having said, "Aging is an extraordinary process where you become the person you always should have been." That is indeed profound, especially in light of the fact that those of us who have put on Christ in baptism have been born again (see Romans 6:1-6) and as such are children of God. As children we are expected to grow and develop, to become the person God would have us to be.

"My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever." (Psalms 73:26) (wbe)
